All options require detox prior to engagement and a commitment to transfer a percentage of Centrelink benefits for the duration of the residential treatment programs. Specific services targeting methadone reduction, women-only, pregnant women and men-only programs, plus HIV, infectious diseases projects and services for co-morbidity issues. Initial contact can be made by the consumer or their health professional. Note: This is a review of the provider's website and the information on it, not a review of the quality of their services.

Current research includes (1) individual vulnerabilities – mental illness, substance use, and gender and health disparities that facilitate risk and hinder adherence to prevention and care; (2) the need for behavioral and social science research to maximize the potential of biomedical prevention and treatment technologies; and (3) effective translation of research into "real-world" practice to close the gap among research, policy, and practice. This Center has published research that impacts on the medical care of the GLBTIQ population and women in heterosexual relationships with a partner who is HIV positive.
